PCC extends hours, will open Saturday to register students for spring semester

PUEBLO – Believing that the current economy provides a great time to get an education, Pueblo Community College is trying to make it easy for students to register for its spring semester, which will begin on Monday, January 12.

PCC has refined its Go!Zone, an enrollment center and it can take care of all of the registration-related needs of new students in an efficient, smooth manner. Located on the second floor of the College Center, the Go!Zone can help students:

- Get started at the Help Desk
- Enroll at the college
- Take an assessment test
- Get advised
- Meet with a financial aid representative
- Register for classes
- Schedule an orientation session

To help handle the expected rush of students this week, PCC's Go!Zone will have expanded hours all this week. It will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday, until 5 p.m. on Friday and from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, Jan. 10.

While the Go!Zone is aimed at new students, continuing students should meet with their department advisor, register online and handle administrative functions in the Financial Aid and Admissions & Records offices. The same expanded hours will be in effect each weekday during the first week of classes.

PCC's spring semester includes classes in full-term and half-term sessions. The full term runs from Jan. 12 to May 1, while half-terms are from Jan. 14 to March 2 (check this) and from March 3 to May 1. Courses are available in daytime and evening hours, and they are offered via traditional classroom means, interactive television, online, and a "hybrid" combination of online and classroom settings.
