



# Nursing Program Admission Criteria

Effective since January 2009

## Requirements for Application to Program

1. Must meet college level basic skills: minimum MAT 090, REA 090, ENG 090
2. Must complete ENG 121, PSY 235, BIO 201, BIO 202, and BIO 204 with a minimum **GPA of 2.5**. (Science courses are valid for no more than 7 years prior to admission.)
3. Complete Letter of Intent (available in the Nursing Department, room HS-202) and submit along with all unofficial transcripts and TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) results. We accept Letters between Jan. 1- March 1 annually.

### Prerequisites

- ENG 121: Eng. Composition (3 cr)
- PSY 235: Human Growth/Development (3 cr)
- BIO 201: Anat. & Physiology I (4 cr w/lab)
- BIO 202: Anat. & Physiology II (4 cr w/lab)
- BIO 204: Microbiology (4 cr w/lab)

### Recommended Courses

- BIO 216: Pathophysiology (4 cr)
- MAT 103: Math for Clinical Calcs (3 cr)
- \*Elective: Humanity or Soc/Behavioral Science

### Admission Requirements

- Minimum GPA 2.5 on prerequisite courses
- TEAS test completion
- Satisfactory background check
- Negative Drug screen
- Immunization Series
- CPR Training for Health Care Providers

## General Information

1. Although not required prerequisites, completion of MAT 103, BIO 216, HPR 108 and Humanities/Social Science elective are recommended prior to beginning the Nursing program, and are **required for AAS degree**. **Note: MAT 103, HPR 108, and BIO 216 must be completed prior to beginning the program's 2nd year (LPN to RN bridge)**
2. Students who complete the departmental application process will have their qualifications reviewed by the program's admission committee. The committee will consider the following criteria in the selection process: prerequisite GPA, completion of all general education courses, and health related work experience. Applicants not accepted for a given year who wish to be considered for a subsequent term must reapply.
3. The first year of the Nursing Program at PCC is only offered as a full-time program; students will be in class, labs, or clinical rotations Monday-Friday. Students who successfully complete the 1<sup>st</sup> year may petition to complete the program as part-time students on evenings and weekends (Pueblo/Fremont campus only, as offered).

\*Humanities/Social Science elective must be from the Guaranteed Transfer Course list at <http://higher.ed.colorado.gov/Academics/Transfers/gtPathways/curriculum.html>
