Mark Twain's Professions

Besides his work as a novelist, speech writer, essayist and short story writer, Mark Twain was a journeyman printer, steamboat pilot, army volunteer, gold prospector, timber prospector, and journalist.

Mark Twain's Writings

Mark Twain wrote novels [principally "The Gilded Age" (1873), "The Adventures of Tom Sawyer" (1876), "The Prince and the Pauper" (1881), "Adventures of Huckleberry Finn" (1884), "A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court" (1889) and "The Tragedy of Pudd'nhead Wilson" (1894)] short stories, speeches, and essays. He also wrote some autobiographical works, including "The Innocents Abroad" (1869), "A Tramp Abroad" (1880), "Life on the Mississippi" (1883), and "Mark Twain's Autobiography."
