PCC gives new job title to Fremont Campus director

Call her Dean Herman now.

To apply uniformity to the administrators of its branch campuses, Pueblo Community College has given a new job title to Jennifer Herman, who oversees the budget, facilities, student services and day-to-day operations of the Fremont Campus in Cañon City. Her title is now “Dean” of the campus or simply “Campus Dean,” whereas she previously was Director of Student and Academic Support.

With a proven track record during the past year, Herman will continue to provide the daily leadership for academic programs and faculty, and she will remain the key administrative contact and participant in community organizations such as the Chamber of Commerce, school district committees and Fremont Campus’ advisory committee. Overall oversight of faculty and academic programs at the Fremont Campus will continue to reside with both the academic dean and department chairs on the Pueblo Campus.

The title of “Dean” will also apply to Dan May, who heads PCC’s branch center in the state’s Four Corners area, which includes offices in Cortez and Durango. His previous title also had been Director of Student and Academic Support.

In addition, that branch’s name has been changed to Southwest Campus after previously being called the Southwest Center. The change provides uniformity to all of PCC’s campus names.

The changes were announced by Marjorie Villani, PCC’s Interim President, after discussions with college administrators, department chairs and staff as well as advisory members. It followed preliminary discussions that started in early 2006 when the late Mike Davis was PCC’s president and began the process of evaluating the administrative structure of the branch campuses.
