Nationally known author on child development to give address to community Feb. 10 at PCC

PUEBLO – James Vollbracht, a nationally known author of five books related to child development, will give a free community address from 4 to 5:30 p.m. Thursday in the Fortino Ballroom at Pueblo Community College. Vollbracht’s speech will focus on his views on the key changes that need to occur in our culture and how to apply them in our schools, organizations and communities.

Vollbracht has been inspiring audiences for more than two decades with his compelling stories, research-based principles, and practical action steps. He is most known for his book "Stopping at Every Lemonade Stand: How to Create a Culture That Cares for Kids."
