**Walt & Gloria Schepp, Frank Cooper
to be inducted into Fremont Hall of Fame**

CANON CITY – The portraits of Walt and Gloria Schepp as well as Frank Cooper will soon be gracing the walls of the Darryl Biggerstaff Learning Resource Center here at the Fremont Campus of Pueblo Community College. On Friday, May 20, they will be inducted into the Fremont Hall of Fame during the fourth annual induction banquet.

The evening will begin with a social hour at 6 p.m. followed by dinner at 7 o'clock and the induction program at 8:00. Tickets to attend are \$50 per person, and reservations can be made by calling 719-549-3301 by May 16. Corporate tables also can be reserved. Proceeds benefit the needs of the college and its students.

The Fremont Hall of Fame was established to honor individuals who, by their extraordinary efforts, have contributed to the betterment or enhancement of Fremont and/or Custer counties. Nominees are considered on the basis of their contributions in the following areas: all facets of education; business and labor; arts and humanities; philanthropy; government; law; science and technology; and health and human services.

Selections are made by a panel comprised of community members and the PCC Board of Directors. The Schepps were chosen for being community supporters and philanthropists, while Cooper's selection was based on his community support and for being a long-time educator.

Persons selected for the Hall of Fame do not have to be Fremont or Custer county natives nor do they have to be current residents. Posthumous nominations are also accepted. Selections are made without regard to gender, race, religion or national origin.

The Schepps and Cooper will be joining an exclusive group that already includes Biggerstaff, Marvin Bradley, Joe Chapman, James Milam, Douglas Miles, Donald Packard and Shirley Squier. The portraits of the previous inductees are already on the wall in the Learning Resource Center.
