Free financial aid help, scholarships to be available at PCC workshop

PUEBLO – Pueblo Community College is offering local high school seniors and college students a deal that's almost too good to be true. This Saturday (March 7), PCC will provide students with free help in filling out Free Application for Federal Student Application (FAFSA) and other scholarship forms and awarding free scholarships.

The forum for the free money and free help is the Financial Aid Scholarship Workshop that will be held from 9 a.m. to noon in PCC's Hoag Theater. Breakfast burritos, coffee and punch will be provided.

College experts will be on hand to provide financial aid and scholarship information as well as assistance with the financial assistance application process. Students are asked to bring all 2008 income tax-related documents and Internal Revenue Service forms as well as documentation of taxed or untaxed income. Staffed computer labs will be available for students to apply for FAFSA and scholarships.
