PCC offering electrician licensing courses

PUEBLO – The Economic & Workforce Development Division at Pueblo Community College is offering courses that provide Professional Development Units (PDUs) toward the renewing, reinstating or reactivating State of Colorado electrical licenses. PCC will provide a quarterly series of topics featuring:

- Electrical Theory and Calculations
- 2011 NEC Code Changes
- Grounding and Bonding
- Wiring Methods

Courses will be held from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturdays. The cost for one course is \$150, which may be taken individually or combined for extra discounts. The instructor will be Ken Shore, a Colorado master electrician and contractor.

New regulations from the Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies may require electricians to take up to 24 hours of technical training in designated training areas after the completion of the state licensing assessment.
