Don't get dropped for non-payment Beginning with the spring term, PCC will begin dropping classes for non-payment. The drop means that after the tuition payment due date, which is Jan. 6, 2010, anyone who has not paid his or her account in full, set up a promissory note and made the first payment, signed a Third party form for full sponsorship or have Financial Aid holding, the account will have all classes dropped for non-payment. The drop for non-payment includes high school students.

Be sure to apply for graduation If you are planning to graduate at the end of the spring semester, you must apply for graduation by completing a planning sheet with your faculty advisor. The application deadline for spring graduates is Jan. 26, 2010 while the deadline for summer graduates who plan to walk in the commencement ceremony this coming May is Feb. 1.
