An info session is scheduled from 6:30 to 8:30 pm Friday, Nov. 12, in AB-130 to provide details about the new Early Childhood Education / Non-Licensure Option bachelor's degree now available at PCC from Adams State College. It uses a hybrid model, with most classes online with some weekend classes but no weeknight attendance. It is designed for students who have completed an associate degree in Early Childhood Education and want to serve in a preschool setting as teachers or leaders but don't want traditional teacher licensure.
