- PCC has 5,100 students currently enrolled at campuses located in Pueblo, Cañon City and Durango.
- PCC has small class sizes with an average of 12 students per class.
- PCC offers more allied health programs than any other college in the State of Colorado. The nursing program provides approximately 90 new RNs annually.
- Thanks to the generosity of Fred Gorsich, PCC is able to provide state-of-the art, technologically-advanced training that ensures a skilled and educated workforce to industry through its Gorsich Advanced Technology Center.
- The PCC Foundation is focused primarily on scholarships that directly assist students with the expenses of seeking higher education.
- One-third of PCC students are attending college for the first time.
- The average age of a student at PCC is 28, and 64 percent of the student body is female.
- PCC is a leader in workforce development and recently constructed a mobile learning lab to better facilitate on-the-job training.
- PCC has a premier early childhood education program; students are welcomed at four-year colleges such as Adam State to finish their bachelor's degree.
- 70% of PCC students are taking vocational programs while 30% are in transfer programs.
